In many ways, the freak show was an explicitly Victorian institution. Defined as a commercial form of entertainment that peddled physiological difference for amusement and profit, the freak show thrived from the 1840s until 1914. At a time when the Victorians were obsessed with taxonomy and classification, so-called freaks disrupted these boundaries. 'Hermaphrodites' were both male and female. Conjoined twins (then better known as Siamese twins) blurred the boundaries of the individual ...
